





Power, Influence, Data Map

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Label each oval with your stakeholders.
 - This is best done at the beginning of a project and yet it will still show relationships and expose some inequities.
 - Start with your funder.
 - Include your agency and if you are housed in an organization, add it to an oval.
 - One oval is for the women, children, and families you serve.
 - Other ovals may represent your evaluator, others upon whom you depend on to do your work.



- 2. Move and adjust the arrows above to map the flow of influence, funding/money, and data for your organization.
 - Use a **RED** arrow to represents the flow of influence among the organizations.
 - Use a YELLOW arrow to represent the flow of funding or money among the organizations.
 - Use a PURPLE arrow to represent the flow of data among the organizations.
- 3. Reflect on the diagram.
 - How might you use this diagram to create more equity? What have we learned?
 - Are there areas where too much influence is exerted? What influence could be reduced or redirected? Who needs more influence?
 - Does the flow of data match influence or is there a mismatch? Do the people you serve participate in the flow of data or is it one way?
 - What does this diagram call us to do?
